She decided to stop, and it was easier than expected. 


I felt the need to write about love because I no longer believe there is anything to rebuild or reinvent. The idea of love must be destroyed.


An introductory essay to feminist philosophy, Existantes offers an accessible synthesis of the major ideas that run through a field in full effervescence, most of which are obscured or, at best, added as footnotes. While the Western philosophical tradition has been built on a universal Subject, feminist philosophers are tracing multiple paths towards a different kind of political subjectivity, exploring ways of thinking about the world in a critical, benevolent, and embodied way. Several feminist theorists are presented here, including Camille Froidevaux-Metterie, Patricia Hill Collins, Iris Marion Young, Simone de Beauvoir, Françoise Vergès, Elsa Dorlin, Judith Butler, and Monique Wittig.



Feminist philosophy means conducting metaphysical and ethical investigations based on our own bodies, which are fragile and intertwined in complex networks of intimate, economic, and political relationships. It means taking as our starting point the context that structures our view as singular subjects. It is a renewal and broadening of philosophical astonishment.

Décoder Disney-Pixar takes an in-depth look at representations (of gender, race, class, handicap and speciesism) in Disney and Pixar productions. The aim of this book is twofold: to question the focus on representations in animated films produced by Disney-Pixar, and to provide readers with tools for socio-cultural analysis of these cartoons and of cinema in general. Without embarking on a destruction of the magic surrounding these films, the goal of the book is to rethink them in a different way, and to rehabilitate and better understand these representations. This high-quality work offers a profound reflection on pop culture, feminism and the fight against discriminations.

Towards Queer Normativity


Since the late 1980s, queer practices and theories have criticized the dynamics of normalization associated with cisgender and heteropatriarchal domination. But this critique has been succeeded by a position that is purely deconstructive of the norms of sexuality, to the point where the new norm has become the refusal of all norms.

Drawing a distinction between normalization and normativity, Pierre Niedergang argues that the criticism of normalization, while legitimate, does not imply an anti-normative stance but, on the contrary, a 'queer normativity'. After examining the impasses of anti-normativity, particularly in relation to sexual violence, the author describes queer normativity as critical, communitarian and vital. Acknowledging the normative inventiveness at work in our communities would enable us to build a queer feminist perspective that is aware of the material dimension of oppression and the power relations at the heart of our relationships, our bodies and our sexualities.





Queer is neither a being or a state ('if I am'), nor the result of an individual will ('if I want') that seeks to assert its uniqueness ('to be unique'). It is a set of practices and theories that are highly conscious of our entrenchment in norms, conscious of the fact that these norms shape the bodily subjectivities that we are.

A Cultural and Feminist Chronicle of the Professional Sports Industry

More and more women are becoming visible in men's professional sport. From spectators, cheerleaders and athletes' spouses, they are now reaching the ranks of coaches, referees and even team managers. Is it a mirage? What exactly is it? Florence-Agathe Dubé-Moreau deconstructs, one by one, the myths surrounding women in the industry, based on her exceptional position as the partner of a famous player, but also as a committed intellectual thrown onto a football pitch in Kansas City. A breeding ground for the worst stereotypes of class, race and gender? Of course it is. A place of resistance where social justice and gender equality come together? Not impossible.



The trigger for this book came in 2014, when my life partner, Laurent Duvernay-Tardif, was drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs, a team in the National Football League in the United States. What I discovered on the other side of the border, inside this select club of men who play ball, profoundly changed my perception of the impact of sport in the fight for gender equality.

Where are women in agriculture, what do they do and under what conditions? Is it still a struggle for those who want to make a place for themselves?





Far from being a purely biological phenomenon, menstruation, and more generally the menstrual cycle, is a socialized experience. Each society develops a dominant menstrual culture, made of more or less acceptable practices, techniques and representations. This book studies the menstrual culture specific to consumerist societies, in which all experiences (especially those of the body) tend to be associated with commercial products. Through the history of three menstrual products - disposable pads, disposable tampons and period monitoring applications - the author continues her investigation into consumerism, everyday objects and the training of so-called "female" bodies.

For all these reasons, most progressive political projects never consider wellbeing as a legitimate tool. But isn't this complete rejection of wellbeing symptomatic of a culture that does not give care the place it should? Wouldn't significant gain come from putting the question of the body, of affects, of gentleness and of spirituality back at the heart of progressive political projects?

This is what Camille Teste sets out to demonstrate in her essay: as long as they are subverted to align them with a truly revolutionary project, practices of wellbeing can be emancipatory.

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



Drawing from her own experience, she helps us understand the obstacles that prevent victims from "obtaining justice" and invites us to rethink what it means to obtain justice beyond the judicial context. She comments on some of the cases that made headlines during the #MeToo movement, taking a closer look at cases involving racialized women, to show the full spectrum of reactions to whistle-blowing and the importance of giving voice to the most marginalized groups.



Kharoll-Ann Souffrant specializes in the issue of the waves of sexual violence denunciations on the web. She is also interested in black feminisms, the struggle against sexual assault and rape culture.

Pinar Selek was born in Istanbul in 1971. She is a sociologist, feminist activist and anti-militarist. Today she lives in exile in France, where she has published several books, novels, stories, essays and articles. In 2023, the trial against her in Turkey was reopened.


Pinar Selek researched the different stages in the construction of male hegemonic domination, trying to "explore the darkness that turns a baby into a murderer".

Her initial fieldwork, carried out in 2007, led her to meet men from very different geographical and social backgrounds over several generations in Turkey, the only thing they had in common being that they had been obligated to do their compulsory military service.

With this new book, which rearranges the elements of her previous research, Pinar Selek extends her reflections, nourished by philosophical references, to our societies as a whole, governed by unbridled capitalism and contempt for women and minorized populations in a global context of wars and the rise of autocratic regimes.



In the face of her retrial after 25 years of judicial persecution in Turkey, Pinar Selek persists and continues her important sociological work!



Professor of Political Science and Feminist Studies at the Université du Québec in Montréal, Francis Dupuis-Déri has published several books among which *La crise de la masculinité* (Remue-ménage, 2018), some of those have been translated or are in the process of being translated into English, Greek, Italian, Japanese, Portuguese, Russian and Turkish.



On November 16th 1980, the Marxist philosopher Louis Althusser strangled his wife, who had decided to leave him. What, then, is the political significance of this femicide and the discourse that subsequently takes shape in the public arena as a justification? Going back to the writings of the murderer and his allies, this essay reconstructs the patriarchal violence of the murder, but also that of male solidarity and the complacency of a cultural elite.



What do we know about Helene Legotien? Almost nothing, except that she was murdered by her well-known husband. In the end, it was she who died twice, and her killer was responsible for both deaths. He caused the first by his own hand, and the second by taking up all the public space to talk about himself, pretending to talk about her death.





Françoise Flamant is a sociologist and economist who spent a long time between France and the United States after playing an active role in the women's liberation movement in France.



The Construction of a Utopia, Oregon, USA, 1970-2010

Published for the first time in 2015 and richly illustrated, this book describes an ideal of community life that is totally opposed to patriarchy. The author immersed herself in the archives of the Women's Lands, a community in Oregon established in the 1970s, and spoke to several of the protagonists of this extraordinary story. Her narrative blends descriptions, analyses, testimonies, and graphic documents to give us a complete picture of the ambition of this project and the determination of the women who took part. This book is an essential contribution to the history of feminism and sheds light on a facet too often neglected: that of lesbian feminists.



Beyond this historical exploration, Françoise Flamant invites us to reflect on the legacy of these communities and the impact of their ideals on contemporary society.



Françoise Flamant is a psychologist and psychotherapist. His work lies at the crossroads between the pragmatic redefinition of a situated politics and taking a stand against the machines of state management and economic integration.



Mechanical restraint is traumatic. Every year, 10,000 people are restrained in French psychiatric hospitals. The phenomenon is widespread in nursing homes, emergency departments and care homes. The restraint system - which ties us down physically, psychologically, and collectively - is growing against the backdrop of a "culture of restraint". If we are to break free from such a culture, we need to listen to the experiences of those affected, and establish other ways of living together in order to develop alternative practices and a different vision of society.




Mechanical restraint is not care, it has no therapeutic dimension. It is a measure of control, a practice of restraint and immobilization. Its abolition is a first step towards a psychiatry based on effective rights, self-determination and dignity for all.











The house is on fire, and they are watching the timer to see when it will be done and cooked. Food is a powerful tool for social transformation nevertheless. It is essential to class struggle, which is also a struggle of pots and pans.

After Faiminisme (2017) and Steaksisme (2021), Nora Bouazzouni asks the killer question: what if the time has come to eat the rich?

Prison Has a Lot on its Plate

From the Marquis de Sade's cell, railing against "dishes the devil wouldn't eat", to the daily meals of people currently deprived of their liberty, the issue of food in prison reflects our social organization and reveals its dysfunctions.
