



In an inner monologue, Annie Cohen reveals herself and returns to the creative process that has marked her entire life, both pictorial and scriptural. Painting and literature intertwine in a passionate gesture, a true life impulse that could keep death at bay. The creation becomes then eminently intense, sexual, organic. Annie Cohen feels, invents and produces through her body, that of a woman crippled by illness. Different personal and artistic themes interpenetrate to open a window on her deep and tormented intimacy. The memories of her youth, the evocation of her mother, the Algeria of her childhood, Paris, are mixed with elements of the author's daily life, and allow a better understanding of the genesis of her writings.

Through her magnificent and singular writing, Annie Cohen carries us away in a passionate flow of words and thoughts. A powerful ode to existence. Life is always there, incandescent and inalienable.



La Retenue is the result of a woman's long healing process, a woman who found the strength to break the silence around incest that every survivor is confronted with. Her family members perpetuated this silence and threatened to destroy her vital psychological resources at any moment, when she was a child, a teenager and even a woman.

With a lucid courage and an incisive style, Corinne Grandemange talks about the multiple sexual abuses and rapes committed by her uncle, in the deafening silence of the adults. She managed to deconstruct the mental prison that survivors are put into and, after going through therapy, she retrained to work for child protection and actively fight against incest. Since incest is secretly present in every aspect of our society, stories like this one pave the way for a collective reflection that is absolutely necessary.


La Malcastrée


In the early 1970s, the psychiatric institution was sometimes extremely violent. This is what the narrator, extremely close to the author, describes. While she is in charge of tying children with Down's syndrome to their seats all day, she decides to rebel and unties them all, thus allowing them to move freely. She goes through painful moments caused by the mistreatment of the institution, alone: the author describes, in this testimony full of rage, the chemical treatments, the forced abortions, the prohibition to write, the loss of the loved one. Until she is expelled — an event paradoxically painful and liberating at the same time.





The male fertilizers are no more, but what about the male children? Against the official discourse, the narrator questions this society and its myths, tracing an apocalyptic history that largely echoes what we are living today. In this delirious adventure and with corrosive humor, Françoise d'Eaubonne, mixes with finesse the genres, from science fiction to essay, passing by utopia and post-apocalyptic narrative.

Françoise d'Eaubonne is the author of more than a hundred books: novels, poems, essays, biographies. A feminist and libertarian activist, she is a pioneer of ecofeminism.



With Luna, she takes dogs who have run away from their authoritarian or violent owners to start a new life. All around her gravitates a heterogeneous and whimsical crowd of sweet dreamers who would not give up the chance to live according to their ideals for anything in the world: Gouel, the Irish sailor and street singer, Alex, the poet and "prince of the garbage", a railroad unionist, Siranouche or the Black Dog, her friend... Some of them are, like her, a little dented, but find in the links that unite them reasons to hope. Because hope is the only option, they are ready to create a new world, freer and brighter, more united and more just.





Jeanne Boucher is pressured to sign with Christophe Lambert, founder of the publishing house Thanatographes. Will she agree to sign a pact with the devil? To give up writing and disappear after having given him a final manuscript? In search of the absolute and of meaning, she has a vital relationship with writing. Is Christophe just a cynical dandy who trades in death? As the story repeats itself, Marie-Madeleine, an impudent and eccentric old woman, is bound by another contract with the enigmatic and tenebrous director Achard Lebrument. What relationship does Marie-Madeleine have with the first protagonists?



When she loses both her job and the man who she thought was the one, she impulsively decides to move to Limoges. But she's not going there to change her life. She heard it was a sad town and so she moves there set on committing suicide. There she meets Tiziana, a blind old Italian woman who takes her under her wing. She also meets Hémon, a young teacher with old school charm who makes her confront a form of otherness she never experienced before. Her sister, Camille, a young mother, comes to visit her at one point. Her outlook is so different that it shakes the walls Anaïs carefully built between herself and the world... In an intimate and moving novel with different portraits of women, Pauline Harmange subtly addresses some hard topics like depression, illness, motherhood and manages to instill the narrative with light and hope.


A woman escapes from the camp where she has been confined after an explosion contaminated her. There, she was submitted to scientific experiments. When travelling through a desert landscape, she remembers her daily life in the camp, and the deep sisterhood built with the other prisoners in the face of adversity. This novel, with its mysterious dreamlike atmosphere, questions the boundary between memory and imagination, dream and reality, and echoes events that have marked the author, as well as the world, such as the Holocaust and the 2004 tsunami that hit India, where she lives part of the year.

Linked together by the terrorist attack at the Bardo Museum in Tunis, an old woman and her granddaughter meet every week in the spring of 2020, in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic. Officially, the granddaughter comes to tell stories, but in fact, it is Nojoum, the grandmother, who tells the tale of her life, from 1949 to 2020, from Tunisia to France.

This family portrait crosses 70 eventful years for Tunisia — independence, revolution(s), women's liberation, but also terrorism, hatred of women, Islamism. Women are the heroines of the stories, who struggle against determinism and against the will of men to find their independence. Women are the ones carrying hope, when facing Islamism and the deep misogyny it carries.






Where the Fire and Bear

Sometimes they are even cruel, princes are helpless and children desperate. And when love triumphs, it is not where you would expect it.

These tales are feminist, modern, even radical but also dark and troubling. And if you encounter Blue Beard, the Little Mermaid or Rapunzel, they have shed their old skins and are ready to lead you on more subversive paths.



Hailed by the critics when it first appeared in Quebec, this collection of wild news stories immerses us in a world peopled by sombre and grotesques characters, A new voice, undisciplined and mixed, calling to mind at times Marie Vieux-Chauvet or Hilda Hilst, Pascale Bernardin alternately explores madness and violence, childhood and social class, memory and Haiti's roots.







Talking about domestic chores, or the diktat of female beauty is often considered as a futile discourse, compared to more serious inequalities between women and men, which should be fought in priority, even exclusively. However, there is no hierarchy, but a continuum. Because when the same system is operating, assigning differentiated and hierarchical places, it necessarily impacts all aspects of life, at home, at work, in the public space, in love and sexual relationships. It is often claimed that the private sphere is the place of individual freedom, removed from societal injunctions, when in fact inequalities in gender relations are at stake.


In this play, Sarah Pèpe allows us to understand the structural inequalities in the heterosexual couple. Her intense writing allows us to follow a mother in each room until the final implosion.
